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Craft Activities

Salt Painting

- Liquid glue
- Salt
- Watercolor paints or food coloring diluted in water
- Paper and create own shape or template of picture (ex. Snowflake, star, heart, basketball, flower, snowman).

How to make:

- Use glue to draw a design or trace a picture template on the piece of paper
- Pour salt on top of the glue, cover the glue with salt, shake excess salt away
- Use paints/food coloring to gently paint over the salt
- Set aside to dry
- Now you have a beautiful picture



Puffy Paint

Materials:

- 1 Cup of shaving cream (white puffy kind)
- ¼ cup of liquid glue
- A few bowls
- Spoon
- Food coloring for colour
- Paper or shape template (ex. heart, snowman, balloon, house, ice cream, etc.)
- Paintbrush

- Place shaving cream in large bowl
- Add liquid glue and mix, if it does not feel a little sticky add a little more glue (the glue is what helps the "paint" dry and stick to paper).
- Stir together
- Divide into a couple smaller bowls
- Add food coloring to bowls and mix to create different colors
- Use paint brush and paint your picture





Pom Pom Shooters

Materials:

- Toilet paper rolls
- Balloons
- Pom poms (for firing)
- Tape
- Scissors
- Markers/ Coloring utensils

How to make:

- Colour your toilet paper roll with markers
- Cut hole in balloon large enough so that you can wrap opening over end of toilet paper roll
- Tape balloon onto paper towel roll
- Fill inside with pom poms and let is go!

Egg Carton Mermaid

- Egg carton
- Scissors
- Paint/markers/glitter glue
- Mermaid body template or paper
- Shells (optional)

How to make:

Cut out egg cartons to they are singles Cut single egg cartons in half Cut out mermaid body template Stick egg carton "scales" to create tail Add tail fin with two triangle pieces of paper to the bottom Colour, paint, glitterize!

How to make:

- Cut large squares, rectangles, circles, triangles, etc.
- Cut small squares, rectangles, circles, triangles, etc.
- Place pieces in divided tray or different bowls
- Create sea creatures/ robots with your child on a separate paper using the glue stick and different pieces to create different shaped creatures/creations.

Rainbow Paper Collage Making

- Scissors
- Glue
- Paper

How to make:

- Cut different colours of paper into small/medium squares
- On a separate piece of paper start to glue colours in half circle like a rainbow.
- Continue until you have a "rainbow" or another shape!

Family T-shirt/Sweater/Blanket (hand/foot prints)

Materials:

- Shirts/sweaters/blanket
- Fabric paint
- Fabic pen (optional)
- Cookie cutter shapes (optional)

- Lay out clothing or blanket on a flat surface that you can leave it to dry
- Paint pictures, stencils, fill in cookie cutter shapes
- Do hand prints or foot prints within the design (optional)
- Let dry









Baking Soda Clay Handprint Ornaments

- 1 ¼ cups of baking soda
- ¾ cup of cornstarch
- ¾ cup of water
- Parchment paper/wax paper
- Rolling pin or flat object like a plate
- Straw
- Small paintbrush
- White glue
- Glitter
- Ribbon
- Clear sealant or Mod Podge (optional)

- To make clay, put ingredients: baking soda, cornstarch and water in pot and heat and stir consistently
- Mixture will begin to thicken and come together in a clump (like mashed potatoes)
- Remove and put in bowl and cover with damp cloth to cool for 10 15 minutes
- To make handprint, create a round of the clay (1 cm thick) or large enough to fit your child's hand
- Flatten with a plate or rolling pin
- Place your child's hand or foot print in the clay and press firmly
- The result is a hand print, if it didn't work try again by rolling up the clay and flattening again. If needed wet your hand a little bit before rolling the ball to add a little extra moisture.
- For an ornament use end of straw to poke one or two holes in it.
- Let dry for a couple of days
- Take ornament out and decorate! Use glitter or paint around the handprint or in the hand print
- Try with ribbon or string
- Hang on tree!





Homemade Wind Chimes

Materials:

- Sticks
- Paint
- Beads
- Painters tape
- Small string/rope
- Hot glue

How to make:

- Use tape/paint to create and design the stick
- Glue on strings to one side of the stick that will be facing down
- Add beads to the strings
- Tie off beads at the end of each string
- Glue on string to other side of stick on each end
- Hang your creation!

Materials:

- Toilet paper rolls or tissue box
- Paint
- Glue stick
- Egg carton or foam balls for eyes
- Construction paper
- Stickers
- Googly eyes
- Markers
- Extra paper/pom poms, glitter, feathers, pipe cleaners etc.

- For Tissue box:
- Remove inner plastic film
- Paint box and leave to dry
- Paint inside black
- Draw mouth with teeth if you like
- Decorate box
- Glue on eyes (pom poms, egg cartons, foam balls, pipe cleaners, etc.)







Pipe Cleaner Finger Puppets

Materials:

- Pipe cleaners
- Pom-poms
- Googly eyes
- Glue gun

How to make:

- Wrap a pipe cleaner around your finder 3-4 times and leave half the pipe cleaner unwrapped
- Fold the straight end of the pipe cleaner to make one ear, secure the middle and make the other ear
- Glue pom-pom over top of the pipecleaner
- Attach googly eyes

Tie Dye Baby Wipes

How to make:

- Pinch center of the baby wipes and hold in your hand
- Twist
- Carefully attach rubber bands
- Colour the sections between the rubber bands
- Remove rubber bands and unveil your masterpiece

Unpoppable Bubbles

- 2 cups of water
- ¼ cup of dish soap
- 2 tbsp of glycerin
- A few pipettes
- Cotton gloves

How to make:

- Cut pipettes on bigger end to act as bubble wand
- Fill bowl with water, dish soap and stir gently (don't make foam)
- Add glycerin (there is a edible version if wanted)
- Stir together slowly
- Put on gloves
- Dip large end of pipette into solution and slowly blow out a bubble
- Enjoy!

Holiday Advent Chain Countdown

Materials:

- Scissors
- Construction paper (4 sheets, can be different colours)
- Googly eyes
- Pom-Poms
- Stapler
- Markers

How to make:

- Cut lines with paper for chains
- Staple the loops together
- If you want it to be a countdown, do as many days are left till Christmas
- Draw on the chains with markers
- If you want a face add googly eyes and smile

Frozen Elsa Inspired Wands

- Coloured craft paper
- Popsicle sticks or sticks
- Jems or glitter (optional)
- Pencil/markers







- Scissors
- Glue stick

- Cut one of the selected papers into a square shape. Make sure it is at least 4 inches x 4 inches in size.
- Fold the square paper into half diagonally.
- Fold the half-folded paper into even thirds.
- Use a pencil to trace the snowflake template pattern on the folded paper from the previous step.
- Keeping the pattern intact, cut off the rest of the paper from the folded paper.
- Unfold the paper. You have now made your paper snowflake
- Cut out a star
- Attach paper snowflake to star and add paper strips to the bottom of the star
- Add popsicle stick
- Add jems/glitter and/or colour





Sensory Activities

Baking Soda/Vinegar Experiments

Materials:

- Small containers or small Tupperware containers
- Baking soda
- Vinegar
- Food colouring
- Baking pan

How to make:

- Put everything inside the baking sheet
- Fill each container ¾ full of baking soda
- Add a few drops of food colouring into each cup
- Mix colour into baking soda
- Add vinegar
- Watch them explode

"Potion" Making

This is a sensory bin. Allow your child to mix random stuff from around the house that is safe together and see how it feels.

Materials: (examples)

- Water
- Baking soda
- Vinegar
- Dish soap
- Milk
- Juice
- Oil
- Salt/Pepper
- Food colouring

Oobleck

- 1 1/2 cups cornstarch
- 1 cup water
- 3 tablespoons paint (optional)

How to make:

 While it will take a little experimentation to get the proper consistency, a good starting place is to mix 1 1/2 cups of cornstarch with 1 cup of water. I added 3 tablespoons of paint to color the suspension, but you can use more or less or leave it out altogether.







- 2. Mix the ingredients using your hands, adding more cornstarch or water as necessary. Note that you may need to use more cornstarch if you live at a high altitude. You'll know you've got the right consistency when it feels similar to honey or molasses, yet "tears" when you drag your fingers across the surface.
- 3. Store the oobleck in a covered container to play with again. The cornstarch and water may separate, but you just simply need to work them back together.
- 4. It is from a Dr. Seuss book Bartholomew and the oobleck if you would like to read it along with the activity.

Slime

- 6 oz Bottle of Glue
- 2 Tablespoons Liquid Starch

How to make:

- Add the glue to a mixing bowl. I used pre-colored glue but you can use white glue and mix with a paint color of your choice.
- Slowly add the 2 tablespoons of Liquid Starch to the bowl.
- Mix with a spoon until it becomes thicker and then continue to mix with your hands until you receive the desired consistency.
- Note: If the slime is too sticky, add more of the liquid starch to the mixture.

Playdoh Making

Materials:

- all-purpose flour
- water
- cream of tartar*
- cheap table salt
- vegetable or canola oil
- food coloring

How to make:

- Into a pot, add 1 cup of flour, 2 teaspoons cream of tartar and 1/3 CUP of salt* to a 2-quart saucepan.

- Add water, vegetable oil, and food coloring. Add a few drops of food color to 1 cup of water, then stir into the flour mixture along with 1 Tablespoon vegetable oil.

-Cook and stir until your playdough starts to solidify. Heat your burner to medium/low and stir. It will be a little lumpy. That's okay.

- Keep stirring your play dough mixture.
- Remove from the saucepan and cool.
- When cool, knead your playdoh to remove lumps.
- Your playdoh is ready to play with!







Smell Inventory

Materials:

- Box or Tupperware container
- Blind fold
- Items that have strong smells and are safe for "kid sniffing"
 - Ex. Coffee beans, peppermint soap, lemon/orange/fruit, a flower, perfume, their favourite kind of juice, a cookie, chocolate, etc.

How to play:

- Have each participant take a turn sniffing with the blind fold on
- Everyone guesses what they think it is
- Reveal the object!
- Who got is right?!
- Repeat as long as you are interested in playing

Water Painting

Materials:

- Watercolour paints
- Paint brush, sponges, hands
- Thick paper or multiple layered paper so that it does not soak through

How to play:

- Paint pictures, animals, favourite characters tv/movies on the paper
- Try different types of brushes to see the difference
- Mix colours together on the paper to see what colour they make together

Elephant Toothpaste

- yeast packet (0.25 oz)
- dish soap
- 1/2 c. 3% hydrogen peroxide
- 3 Tbsp warm water
- food coloring
- 1/2 c measuring cup
- funnel
- empty water bottle
- cake pan
- small bowl
- measuring spoon (1 Tbsp)
- small spoon

How to make:

1. Place empty water bottle in the cake pan







- 2. Pout ½ cup of hydrogen peroxide into the empty bottle using a funnel
- 3. Squirt a small amount of dish soap into the bottle (about 1 tbsp)
- 4. Swirl the bottle to mix it together
- 5. Add a couple drops of food colouring to the mixture in the bottle for colour (optional)
- 6. In a small bowl: combine yeast packet, 3 tbsp of warm water and mix till yeast is dissolved
- 7. Dump the yeast mixture into the bottle
- 8. Watch it turn into elephant toothpaste!

Cheerio Sandbox

This is the same as a regular sandbox and you can use all the same tools as a normal sandbox but the "sand" is edible, making it safe.

Materials:

- Cheerios
- Way to crush the cheerios
- Sandbox tools
- Can hide treats/snacks within the "sandbox" for your child to find
- Spoon, fork, measuring cups, tablespoon measures, funnel (optional)
- Let your imagination take you!

How to make:

- Crush cheerios to make the sand
- Put into large bowl or cake pan
- Add treasures to find
- Use toons or kitchen objects to play in the sandbox

Pretend Snow (baking soda and white conditioner)

Materials:
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- 2 ½ cups of baking soda

- Bowl
- Pan for play

- Add ingredients together in a bowl
- Stir
- Enjoy! Make shapes, feel the texture, make a snowman or have a mini snowball fight with toys. Let your imaginations go!!!





Texture Balloons/Stress Balls

How to make:

- Stretch balloon open
- Add playdoh inside or flour or cornstarch
- Tie the balloon closed

- Mix together and play
- Can add kitchen or sand toys to play with it in the sand
- Can hide treasures (small toys) as a treasure hunt if desired

Rainbow Rice

- food colouring or icing gels

How to make:

- For each colour of rice combine 1 cup of rice, ½ tsp of vinegar and food colouring

- Shake each colour to let the colour mix
- Spread them out on a cookie sheet or in a pan and place in the sun or near a fire for until dry

How to make:

- In a bowl, mix the lotion and cornstarch together until combined.
- Separate and add food coloring to make different color dough! (optional)
- Play!

Edible Ocean Sensory Play

- Pan
- Edible fish (optional)
- Tongs, tweezers or other fine motor tools (optional)

How to make:

- Blue gelatin or two large 6 oz. boxes of Jell-o and followed the directions on the box for the Jello.
- Put Jello in bowl/pan or shape of choice and chill.
- Buy edible fish or use fish toys for inside the jello.
- Jumbo tweezers or another fine motor tool of your choice (optional)
- Kids with *clean* hands if you want to let them eat this afterward
- Get Jelloing!

Bubble Foam

- tear free bubble bath
- water
- food coloring
- hand mixer
- Toys to play in the bubble foam with
- Pan or storage tub for play

- Mix two parts water to 1 part bubble bath soap
- If you want to do multi-colours make smaller batches ½ cup of water and ¼ cup of bubble bath soap





- Mix in food colouring with hand mixer for 1 minute on high
- You will make stiff peaks (like whipping cream)
- Put in pan or storage tub for play
- Add toys or just enjoy the bubbles
- Play!





Active Activities

Balloon Baseball

Materials:

- Balloons (blown up)
- A stand of some sort to place the balloon (if you don't want to toss the balloon when hitting)
- Baseball bat, paper towel or thing to hit the balloon with
- Three pillows, areas or items to act as bases
- Multiple players

How to play:

- Set up three bases and home base
- Blow up balloons
- Place balloon on stand to hit
- Have first player come up to batt
- Hit the ball and run around the bases
- Play!

Obstacle Course

- Can either set up without your child or with if they would like to help
- Create an obstacle course either in a circle or in a designated area
- Set up chairs to go around or go over, tables to crawl under, pillows to jump between or over, cushions to push over or move from one stop to another, and stuffed animals to hug, toss or move from one place to another, etc.
- Let everyone have a turn going through the obstacle course! Can make it competitive if desired and time everyone

How to play:

- This is so that your children will have to crawl, step over or maneuver around the tape
- The idea is to get through the hallway without touching any of the tape!

Floor Is Lava Game

Materials:

- Paper or pillows
- Tape (optional)
- Open space

How to play:

- Place pillows or paper around the room close enough to step or jump between based on your child's abilities
- Can tape down if paper if wanted
- Have a beginning and end point.
- Can also use couches or chairs in how to get from one side of the room to the other
- Play!
- Can time if you want it to be competitive.

Snowball Fight/Snowman Making/Snow Angels

Materials:

- Weather specific: Will need snow (for snowman sticky snow)
- Snowsuits

- Put on snowsuits/snowgear and go outside
- To make a snowballs: grab snow, smush together (throw at one another, can have teams or a feel for all)
- To make a snowman: make a snowball but continue to roll until as large. Make a large ball, a medium ball, and a small ball for the head. Stack the balls! You have a snowman
- To make a snow angel: Lie down in the snow with your arms and legs out like a star. Move your arms back and forth in the snow like a bird. Carefully get up! And look at your beautiful snow angel that you made!





Puzzle Piece Hunt

Materials:


- Children's puzzle
- Place to make the puzzle once the pieces are found

How to play:

- This game is a puzzle scavenger hunt
- Hide/Place the puzzle pieces around a room or in the designated area to be found
- Have your child go around and find all the puzzle pieces
- Make the puzzle

Paint Chip Color Hunt

Materials:

- Pick up some paint chips or various colours from a local hardware store if you don't already have one lying around
- If you don't have paint chips use a couple different colours of construction paper

How to play:

- The game is to find items that match each colour as close as possible to the colours on the paint chip
- Can time it to make it competitive if wanted

Figure Skating

Materials:

- Dryer sheets/paper towel squares/mittens on feet/or tissue papers
- Mittens, hat (optional)
- Large area for skating (not carpeted)

How to play:

- Clear an area (can rope off to pretend it is more a skating rink if desired)
- Put on hat and mittens and your feet have dryer sheets or paper towel squares under it
- Glide across and around the "ice"

Red-Light, Green-Light, Yellow-Light, Purple-Light, Blue-Light

How to play:

- Have your child either be it or line up against a wall in a large space or hallway
- Leader calls out; Yellow, Green, Red, Purple, Blue
- Your child or others need to follow directions as they try to make it to the other side of the room/hall
- Can play as long or little as players would like
 - Yellow Light: Slow crawl on the ground
 - Green Light: Jump like a frog
 - Blue Light: Try and touch the sky
 - Purple Light: Do a silly dance
 - Red Light: Stop! Freeze.

Hide-and-Seek

- Make it more active by having them hide on different levels of your house every time, that way they're going up and down stairs every few minutes.
- Have a hider and seeker
- Have seeker count to 10 and then go and find the hider
- Make it to be in one room or on a certain area of the house
- Play!



Simon Says

How to play:

- Have a leader and a follower
- Can take turns being the leader
- Say "Simon Says" before doing the action
- Make sure you still make them a little silly think animal movements, dramatic actions and anything on one foot.
- Can use action bingo on handout further up for action suggestions

Twister

Materials:

- Twister game or pieces of paper
- Tape (if using paper)
- Bottle to spin (if using paper)

How to play:

- Get in a good stretch by playing a game of twister. Don't have the game? Make your own by taping construction paper circles on the floor.
- Create a spinner by a spinning a bottle and four colours of construction paper that are also the twister squares
- The "board is 6 by 4
- 6 pieces of paper per colour all lined up close to each other
- Tape down the pieces of paper
- Play!
- Person "spinning" choose hand or feet for each time spinned for colour (can make it easier of harder for participants)

Bubbles!

Everyone loves Bubbles! Materials:

Bubbles

- Take turns blow some with a wand and challenge your kids to pop them all before they touch the ground
- prompting lots of jumping and diving
- High fiving the bubbles
- Clapping the bubbles to pop them
- Kicking the bubbles
- Blowing the already blow bubbles to see if you can get them to move



Uno Movement Game

Materials:

• Uno cards (can get at dollar store, Walmart, or amazon)

How to play:

- Grab a deck of Uno Cards and assign actions to each number.
- Flip a card over and *everyone* gets up and completes the task.
- Be enthusiastic so that your child will want to join in

Put on a Fashion Show

Kids love to dress-up, and this idea brings that love to the next level.

Materials:

- Cloths or dress up cloths (something not ordinary) Can include mittens, hats, scarfs, big coats, heels/boots, etc.
- Tape or paper
- Pump up music (optional)

- Create a long runway out of tape or paper and invite your fashionistas to perform their best walk while you pump the music.
- You can play the judge awarding points for style, creativity and their overall strut. (optional)





Family Time Activities

Sink or Float

Materials:

- Things that you can see if they sink or float
 - Ex. Ball, toy car, small toy, large toy, doll, pencil, pen, cup, leaf, pinecone, etc.
- Large bowl, tube, Tupperware container of water
- Fill container with water

How to play:

- Fill container with water
- Ask child if they think the object will float or sink
- Try to get a variety of objects that will float and sink
- Play!

Drumming Videos/Activities

Materials:

- Computer or TV (that can connect to YouTube)
- Musical instruments or use some Tupperware and some chop-sticks to drum along

How to play:

- Get the whole family to musically join!
- Put on one or more of the videos and drum, shake or sing along

Materials:

- Graham crackers
- Hard icing

Materials:

- Different shapes, animals, food, or characters.
- Everyone has to guess what you have drawn without the drawer saying anything





Guessing Games (20 questions, guess the smell, block box)

Materials:

- Anything to make guess about (can only use your mind or)
- A box
- A blind fold

How to play:

- Either do it with just sitting around as a family and making guesses about something that one person is thinking about or....

Materials:

Pretzel Kisses

Crinkle Cookies

Materials:

- 1 cup unsweetened cocoa powder (120 g)
- 2 cups granulated sugar (400 g)
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter (preferred) or oil (115 g)
- 4 eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract (10 ml)
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 cups all-purpose flour (240 g)
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar (50 g)

How to make:

- 1. Involve the whole family in the making process!
- 2. In the bowl of a stand mixer, beat the cocoa, granulated sugar and butter (or oil) on medium speed.
- 3. Reduce the speed to low and add 1 egg at a time until combined.
- 4. Mix in the remaining ingredients in the order listed, for the exception of the powdered sugar.
- 5. Cover the bowl with plastic wrap and chill in the refrigerator
- 6. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.
- 7. Line cookie sheets with parchment paper. Roll the dough into 1-inch balls and coat with powdered sugar. Place on the prepared baking sheet at least 2 inches apart.
- 8. Bake for 10 12 minutes. Allow the cookies to rest on the hot cookie sheet for one minute before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

Mars Bars Rice Krispie Treats

Materials:

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter (56 grams)
- 4 Mars bars (53 grams each)
- 3 cups Rice Krispies / Rice Bubbles
- 1 cup milk chocolate chips, or 200 g chopped milk chocolate for the topping
- If you want your bars a little gooier, you could use 2 1/2 cups Rice Krispies.

- In a large saucepan, melt the butter over very low heat.
- Add in the chocolate bars, chopped into small pieces.
- Gently stir the mixture as the bars begin to melt and ooze into the butter. It's very important that the burner is on low heat, otherwise the caramel and chocolate can start to burn instead of melt.
 - Pro Tip: If the butter and melted chocolate bars are starting to separate as they melt, remove the pan from the heat and whisk vigorously.
- Once totally melted, carefully stir in the cereal then press the mixture into a greased 8×8 inch (20×20 cm) pan.
- Then a layer of creamy, melted milk chocolate goes on top and your bars are ready to set.







• Firm up at room temperature because when you put chocolate in the fridge to harden it can discolor and get those weird little white flecks on top.

Cookie Ornaments

- Cookie sheet
- Waxed paper
- Forks
- bowls
- White chocolate / milk chocolate (to melt)
- Oreos
- Mini peanut butter cups
- Candies, sprinkles (decorating candies)

How to make:

- First, line a cookie sheet with waxed paper and set aside.
- In a medium bowl, melt the white chocolate according to package directions.
- Dip each Oreo cookie into the melted chocolate using a fork
- Next, place the coated Oreo onto the prepared baking sheet.
- Attach one mini Peanut Butter Cup on the top of each Oreo, as an ornament topper.
- Immediately decorate the Oreos with the assorted candies or sprinkles.
- Refrigerate for at least 10-20 minutes before serving or packaging, or until the white chocolate hardens.

Parachute

How to play:

- Get the whole family to play
- Grab a bed sheet and get your whole family involved everyone taking a side and rapidly moving your arms up and down. Put some small balls or balloons on top and try and fling them off. Kids love this one! (fitted sheets work best)
- Go up really fast and try to sit inside it with the air and my a mushroom shape!

Materials:

- A open space for the race, a start and end
- Wind up toys

- Get the whole family involved
- Each person gets a windup toy
- Count down and set all of the toys at the same time
- See which ones goes the farthest, fastest or does the most of a certain thing
- Multiple races
- Be enthusiastic to encourage the whole family to participate!





Toy Hide and Seek

Materials:

• Various toys big and small that they are interested in

How to play:

- Hide various toys around a room or a certain area
- Have a list so that they can check it off every time they find one
- Make it a game for the whole family
- Can make it a competition or work together to complete the hide and seek.

Balloon Hockey

Materials:

Two laundry baskets

Hockey sticks, kid's golf clubs or even the cardboard from inside of a large tube of wrapping paper. Bag of balloons

- Get the whole family involved
- Split the family into teams and see which team can get the most goals.
- Use different types of sticks to make the game different
- Can also use hands or feet as another variation
