Summary of Duties

Reporting to the Clinical Manager, and under the supervision of a Behaviour Consultant / Clinical Supervisor, the Autism Therapy Assistant provides direct client care through the implementation of behaviour plans as well as training/education to parents/caregivers, other Grandview clinicians and community mediators. The Autism Therapy Assistant accepts assignments of clients for direct service; assists in indirect client care; assists with other delegated tasks such as completion of direct and indirect assessments as appropriate; documents his/her involvement in client care; ensures that the treatment environment meets the client's needs; supports clients with personal care needs (including toileting, feeding, handwashing, etc.); maintains clinical competence; maintains communication with all other staff members; supports program/Centre efforts in Quality Improvement and Risk Management activities; participates in education, orientation and public relations; maintains a safe work environment and performs other related duties, as assigned.

Specific responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Assists in direct client care through implementing behaviour plans in the Ontario Autism Program Durham and other outpatient programs by:
- Conducting treatment sessions to target goals identified by the Behaviour Consultant and outlined in the Behaviour Plan for communication, social skills, play and leisure, motor, school readiness, personal responsibility/ adaptive, cognitive functioning, self-regulation
- > Behaviour and vocational assisting the Behaviour Consultant with assessment procedures
- > Delivering evidence based behavioural services and training
- > Collecting and graphing data relating to the client's goals
- Delivering family/caregiver educational workshops and parent training
- Provides assistance to clients with personal care needs
- > Assisting in parent workshops/programs and planning activities in group treatment program;
