Recreation Therapist (Contract Part-Time)

- 18.75 hours per week (.5FTE)
- Contract Duration: May 2025 – October 31, 2026
- Salary: \$33.56 to \$41.19 per hour, depending upon experience
- Hybrid/Onsite

Under the direct supervision of the Clinical Manager, Clinics and Specialized Services, the Recreation Therapist completes an assessment of clients referred for therapeutic recreation services to identify strengths and problem areas to promote an optimal leisure lifestyle and determining recreation interests and goals; establishes written treatment goals and plans to address client problem area; facilitates planning, implementation and evaluation of goal-oriented therapeutic recreation programs, provides leisure counselling and education for clients and families upon discharge; provides direct and indirect client care in accordance with the treatment plan; evaluates the impact of recreation therapy intervention on identifies problems and makes recommendations for change; maintains communication with all other team members regarding client care; participates with other organizations within the community to increase capacity for client leisure participation documents recreation therapy involvement in client care; oversees activities in the recreation therapy area which may be carried out by the therapy assistant; ensures that the environment of the recreation therapy treatment area meets client's needs; maintains clinical competence; maintains communication all other staff members; supports departmental/Centre efforts in Quality Improvement Program (QIP) activities; participates in education, orientation and public

relations as required; maintains a safe work environment; and performs other duties as assigned.

Responsibilities

- Assessing clients referred to therapeutic recreation to identify strengths and problem areas to promote an optimal leisure lifestyle and determine recreation interests and goals with the use of standardized assessment instruments.
- Assessing the clients' level of function in terms of daily living skills, leisure patterns, physical literacy, neuro-developmental and sensory motor impairments, and cognitive deficits etc.
- Obtaining data and reviewing medical records to identifying strength and problem areas.
- Establishing written treatment goals and plans to address client problem areas targeting client strengths, problem areas and barriers to participation within the scope of recreation therapy.
- Analysing identified problems and determining the treatment approach to facilitate the achievement of therapeutic goals.
- Establishing a treatment plan in conjunction with the client, family/caregiver in order to ensure that the clients/family/caregivers goals are considered.
- Negotiating and establishing overall client goals treatment with client, family and other members of the treatment team to ensure agreement and participation with the family.
- Facilitating, planning, implementation and evaluation goal-oriented therapeutic recreation programs by ensuring that the program is delivered in a manner which is consistent with identified client goals and caseload priorities.
- Developing a written program and implementation plan that includes: statement of purpose, outcome statements, enabling objectives, performance measures and content and process descriptions;
- Making appropriate recommendations for change and updating implemented recommendations into program plans.
- Providing leisure counselling and education for clients/families.
- Providing direct and indirect client care in accordance with the treatment plan.
- Evaluating the outcome of Recreation therapy intervention on identified problems and making recommendations for change.
- Collaborating with team members within the multi-disciplinary setting as appropriate.

Qualifications

- Degree in Recreation and Leisure Services with a major in Therapeutic Recreation
- Registered Professional with Therapeutic Recreation Ontario (TRO). Current Certification with National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC) preferred.
- At least three years' experience working with children, youth and their families with physical and developmental disabilities, and experience planning and facilitating group recreation programs.
- Strong problem solving, organizational skills, and decision making skills
- Ability to set priorities and time management
- Ability to work within multi-disciplinary teams.
- Valid Ontario driver's licence.
