

Line orientation


For initial practice, use double –lined paper. Explain all different lines and spaces as shown below.

Purpose of the spaces and lines:

- a) midline controls the size of the letters
- b) baseline helps guide letter placement
- c) top space maximum height and/or starting point for tall letters; should also touch the baseline
- d) middle space for small letters or lowercase letter placement; these letters should touch the midline and baseline.
- e) bottom space for descending letters; these letters should touch the midline and uses bottom space

midline 🦳	Top space
	middle space
baseline	bottom space

Once the child has mastered using the double-lined paper, he/she is ready to use regular-lined paper. Print on the lines skipping one line at a time so it is easier to read
