ACCESS2 – Easter Seals

What it is	A paid membership for people living with a permanent disability resulting in the need of a support person to access recreation facilities and activities
What is costs	\$20 for a 3 year membership or 30\$ for a 5 year membership
How to apply	 Complete the online or paper application form Contact one of your health care providers (your Recreation Therapist for example) to complete "Section C" Submit your application and payment by mail, fax or email
What is covers	A support person (parent/PSW/caregiver) can attend venue/activity for free or reduced cost Child pays full admission cost based on their age
Participating venues	Flying Squirrel, Sky Zone Whitby, Reptilia, CNE, movie theaters in Ontario (Cineplex, Landmark, Rainbow Cinemas, Imagine Cinemas), Pickering museum, Chestnut Hill Developments Recreation Complex, AGO, Ripley's Aquarium, CN Tower, Casa Loma, Ontario Science Centre, ROM, Toronto Zoo, and may more (visit their website for complete list, or call ahead to inquire, many other establishments accept the ACCESS2 card)
